MAKING SENSE OF SCIENCE UPDATE

The first draft of our latest <u>SAPEA</u> project <u>Making sense of science</u> under conditions of complexity and



uncertainty is now complete. Three working group meetings took place between September and December. The Making Sense of Science SAPEA Working Group is formed by

16 experts from 13 countries. The Academia Europaea is the lead academy on this project, with work carried out by the Cardiff Hub. AE was represented at the meetings by Professor Ole Petersen, Louise Edwards and Dr Esther Dorado-Ladera.



Handover of the new SAPEA report to the Group of Chief Scientific Advisors

Professor Ole Petersen handed over

a new SAPEA (Science Advice for Policy by European Academies) report to the European Commission Group of Chief Scientific Advisors (GCSA) on behalf of the SAPEA Board. Professor Petersen was representing Professor Sierd Cloetingh, President Academia Europaea and current Chair of the SAPEA Board. This new SAPEA evidence review report, entitled <u>A scientific perspective on microplastics</u> in nature and society, has been written by a group of world-leading experts nominated by academies across Europe, including AE, and informs the Scientific Opinion from the GCSA.

The Cardiff Hub held its annual <u>Steering Group meeting</u> at Cardiff University on 14th January. AE's 30th Annual Conference, Barcelona


